

Plans for wind farm

PROFITS from a new wind farm would be used to tackle fuel poverty, say developers.

West Coast Energy has submitted a planning application for three 81m turbines near Rhoscefnhir on Anglesey.

The company has signed an agreement with National Energy Action Cymru to give 10% of the wind farm's profits in its first five years to tackling fuel poverty.

The company says this will amount to

£50,000 in the first five years. The money will be used to offer advice and raise awareness about energy efficiency.

The so-called Braint wind farm will be the first to use the scheme, which will be adopted by all of West Coast Energy's future wind energy projects.

The wind farm's community benefit fund will continue beyond the development's first five years, but West Coast Energy said future recipients would be decided at a later date.

AAWT has no further information at this time and is waiting to see the verified plans before commenting.
